You will need to reference these texts for various writing assignments, book club discussions and other projects.

When you return to school, you will write about or discuss each of these four books. Complete the assignments described on the given “Summer Reading Mini Projects” handout in order to take note of the essential elements of the story and your personal reaction and opinion.

Those of you who worked with Mrs. Onest in sixth grade English spent a lot of time considering the big question “What is identity?” Next year in Form I English, we will also keep returning to a thematic question “What is empathy?” Empathy, the ability to imagine someone else’s situation, sounds simple but is a creative and complex part of being human. As you read your summer books, begin to think about how this concept might connect to them—and to your life.
